Eli'melech + Naomi; of Bethlehem

two sons Mahlon + Chilion

Went to Moab because of famine  
<sup>no frost</sup>

Eli'melech dies

Sons marry (Orpah + Ruth)

Mas'hitte women thus  
disobey'd God - result of  
above

Naomi now alone -

plans to return to land of Israel

daughters-in-law asked to

return to their friends

Orpah returns

Ruth "cleaves" ... Thy people  
shall be my people + Thy God  
my God

In Bethlehem Ruth continues  
faithful to Naomi

Boaz redeems Eli'melech's

land + marries Ruth

has son Obed the father of

Jesse father of King David

I Samuel - men's "asked of the Lord"  
1st of 4 books of the Kingdom  
authors - Samuel, Nathan, Gad  
records kept in the Ark of Covenant  
Samuel started the school(s) of  
the prophets  
chronology

1090 Samuel born

1080 called of God

1070 Eli dies Samuel judge

1040 Saul begins to reign

1015 Samuel dies

1010 Saul killed - David King  
over Judah

1003 David King of all Israel

Ch-1 Birth of Samuel to Elkanah  
and Hannah his barren wife  
(Peninah had children - provoked  
Hannah deliberately)

Hannah prays for a son - vows to  
give him to the Lord all his life  
dedicates Samuel to God at weaning  
age 2 or 3 yrs.

God gave Hannah 5 more children  
3 boys + 2 girls

Eli's wicked sons - Hophni and Phinehas - stole from the sacrifices, committed terrible sins

Eli tried to get them to stop their sin but did not remove them from the priesthood

Visit of the man of God

There will never be an old man in your family

Your sons will die in one day

Samuel ministers in the Tabernacle at Shiloh

The Lord calls Samuel 3x

The 4th time Samuel says "Speak Lord for thy servant heareth"

1st 3:19 "And Samuel grew and the Lord was with him, and did let none of his words fall to the ground."

Victory of the Philistines - ark taken  
Hophni & Phinehas killed. Eli dies 98 yrs old. Judged Israel 40 yrs.

Samuel's leadership - Judge for 30yrs

defeats philistines

Circuit judge from Shiloh  
to Bethel, Gilgal, Mizpeh

King Saul

Israel demands a king - To be like other nations

Samuel very unhappy with this request

God permits it

Samuel meets Saul

Saul's father Kish sends Saul to look for lost donkeys

Saul comes to Samuel

Samuel anoints him King

Saul anointed King before the people - had 4 shoulder

taller than other men

Saul's Kingdom - 40 years

Son Jonathan a good man and a good general

Saul's sin

disobedience - offered sacrifice

disobedience - amalek  
Saul rejected

## David's Preparation

Anointed by Samuel - the youngest of Jesse's 8 sons  
The Shepherd boy from Bethlehem  
Sent to check on his brothers  
Who are in Saul's Army  
The Philistines & Goliath  
David becomes a captain in  
Saul's Army - wins more  
battles than Saul  
Jonathan's friendship  
Saul's jealousy & hatred  
Death of Saul & his sons at  
Gibeah - King for 40 yrs  
- The Amalekites' claim - David's  
son Absalom - dies

## II Reign

@ Hebron

David becomes King over Judah  
for 7 years there is strife between  
David & house of Saul (Ishboseth)  
David defeats Philistines  
recaptures ark of covenant  
<sup>Ishboseth killed by his servants</sup>  
David becomes King over all Israel  
Greatest King Israel had  
man after God's own heart  
Prepared for the Temple - prophet Nathan

David also sinned - adultery + murder  
absalom kills amnon  
" overthrows David

Unlike Saul, he confessed and repented - was forgiven

King over all Israel for 33 yrs

Israel's greatest poet

wrote most of the psalms

Israel greatest king

Also a prophet - mainly of Christ - suffering, death, and resurrection

man after God's own heart - love donations from for Megilah eseth  
given soul's lands - ate @ the King's Table

## I Kings

David is old and dies

Solomon becomes King

Solomon dreams in Gibeah : ask

"what I shall give you"

"an understanding heart to judge  
the people" 3:9

Solomon's wisdom tried - The 2 women  
+ one living son  
Wisest of all men

Solomon's glory

ruler over all Israel

one day's provision: 10 fat oxen

20 pasture oxen, 100 sheep plus

all kinds of game (deer etc.)

### Great Army

40,000 stalls of horses for chariots  
12,000 horsemen

### Great learning

Spoke 3000 Proverbs e.g. bring up a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not depart from it"

Came from all over the world to see and hear him  
Queen of Sheba

### Solomon's Temple

1st temple built for God  
Took 7 years to build

### Solomon's mistake

had 1000 wives

1 Kings 11:4 "his wives turned away his heart after other gods"

11:6 and Solomon did evil in the sight of the Lord God

### God's punishment

Stirred up enemies against him

Jeroboam son of Nebat

met by prophet Ahijah

Tore it into 12 pieces

asked him to take 10.

To set 10 tribes after Solomon dies

Solomon dies - king for 40 yrs

Rehoboam reigns

Jeroboam comes back from

Egypt + is elder of Israel

confront Rehoboam

asked - lighten our load

answer in 3 days

answer - counsel of the old

men refused - "I will

make your burden heavier

my father chastised you

with whip, I will " "

with Scorpions" 1K 12:14

Kingdom divided

So. ← Rehoboam - Judah + Benjamin

No. ← Jeroboam 10 Tribes

Both wicked Kings

1Kings ch 16 Ahab - most wicked of  
Israel's kings

Tezebel concubine (Sidon)

brought 400 Prophets of Baal

I Kings begins ē death of David

ch 17 Elijah's pronouncement  
"As the Lord God of Israel liveth  
before whom I stand, There  
shall not be dew nor rain  
These years, but according  
to my word."

Elijah at brook cherith - fed  
by ravens

To the widow of Zarephath  
Barrel of meal & cruse of oil  
lasted for 3 1/2 yr  
raising the widow's son  
"Go shew yourself to Ahab"  
meets Obadiah

meets Ahab

The Challenge - Elijah vs the  
the 400 prophets of Baal on Carmel  
"If the Lord is God follow him  
if Baal follow him"  
prophets of Baal can't call down  
fire to burn the bull  
4 barrels of water

Prophets of Baal killed

Jezabel kills Naboth to give  
Ahab Naboth's vineyard

Ahab killed - dogs licked his blood

## II Kings Ch 1-17 North. Kingdom

Elijah taken to heaven in a fire chariot

Elisha the new Prophet of God

The Shunemite given a son

for dies & is raised by Elisha

Naaman the leper - Syrian General

one wicked king followed another

all like Solomon & Ahab

worshippers of idols

led the people away from God  
manasseh offered gods dough as sacrifice

Assyria (King Shalmaneser - Sargon)

defeats the northern Kingdom

The people taken into captivity

Other people from Babylon

brought to Judah

people of Northern Kingdom

never restored

only the tribe of Judah remain

Ezra + Nehemiah - histories of the  
restoration + rebuilding

Haggai, Zechariah - prophets during  
the rebuilding (post exile)

## Ezra & Nehemiah

538 Cyrus the Mede conquered Babylon  
ordered release of captive nations

70 years had passed since Judah was  
taken into captivity

People were to return and rebuild  
the temple of God in Jerusalem  
1<sup>st</sup> act was to build God's altar  
& offer sacrifices.

2<sup>nd</sup> building foundation of the temple  
3<sup>rd</sup> building " of the city wall

The work brought to a standstill  
enemies of Judah (People of the  
land around them) wanted to  
help in the building but were  
denied (these later called  
Samaritans)

asked King of Persia to stop the  
building

Work resumed & completed

## Nehemiah

Cupbearer of King Artaxerxes

- Hears that the wall of Jerusalem has been broken down + its doors destroyed
- Prayed + fasted because of it. ? by the king
- Prays to God + asks the king for permission to go help rebuild
- Permission given
- The work completed leads the people to repentance to prayer + to covenant to follow the Lord

date: 483 B.C.

near the end of the captivity

Persian Kings: Cambyses → Cyrus → Darius  
Xerxes ↙

Vashti restored several years later

# Esther

posted

Setting - palace of Shushan (Susa)

in Elam one of 3 capitals of Persian Empire

Time 3<sup>rd</sup> yr of Ahasuerus (Xerxes)

toward end of captivity      son of Darius

author - possibly Ezra, ? Mordecai

Deborah (not mentioned) written

when it was dangerous to mention

worship of God (see Dan. 6: 7-17)

v4. wealth of the empire - boro to inventory  
display

v5. closed to 7 day feast

End of the feast Vashti asked to appear  
to display her beauty

v12. Vashti refuses - embarrasses the king  
counsel of the 7 Princes of Med. + Perse

(the supreme court) - Vashti to be  
removed as queen

ch 2 - The new queen

chosen from the most beautiful young  
women of the empire

Esther - a Jewish girl - beautiful + charming  
adopted by Mordecai after her  
father + mother died - her father was  
Mordecai's Uncle

Mordecai taken into captivity by Nebuchadnezzar

Mordecai - a man intent on doing good  
adopted Esther the orphan his cousin (uncle)  
Groomed & prepared her for queen  
Sought her welfare daily 2:11  
Saved Xerxes life 2:21-23

Mordecai - probably doorkeeper at the palace  
(Prov 3:27) "Withhold not good from them  
+ when it is due, when it is in  
the power of your hand to do it."

Mordecai had done good to Esther  
Being good to friends & relatives to be expected  
Xerxes was a fickle cruel monarch

Christ calls us to go farther: Rom 12:20-21 If your  
enemy hunger feed him if he thirst give him drink  
in so doing you heap coals of fire on his head.  
Be not overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good

Esther - the most loved by Ahasuerus  
and becomes queen

2:21-23 Mordecai reveals a plot by 2  
of the King's servants to assassinate him

Xerxes was assassinated 14 yrs later

### Haman's plot

Haman promoted to highest offices of  
the land - all were to bow down  
to him

Mordecai refuses to bow - Haman  
becomes very angry

Haman persuades the King to destroy  
the Jews because they are a people  
<sup>Distinctives of</sup>  
<sub>(God's people)</sub> that "keep themselves apart,  
have different laws, and do  
not keep your laws."

② offers to contribute 10,000  
16 million oz talents (103#/talent) of Silver to  
the treasury -

- total yearly revenue of Persian  
empire was 17,000 talents (Herod.)

i.e. 2/3 of annual revenue

- The empire had been impoverished  
after the recent Greek wars

- expected to get this from the  
Jew's possessions

Security + stability tend to produce lethargy + insensitivity  
to the needs + circumstances of others  
There is a danger in comfort

The deliverance of God will come

He stood at the forks of the road of our life - usually  
having a low profile + going unnoticed

Mordecai learns the plan - inside  
sources

• Mordecai's appeal to Esther 4:5-14  
especially v 14

v 5 Esther wants to know why Mordecai  
is grieving - Sends Hatach

v 7-9 Mordecai's message to Esther

v 10-11 Esther's heartenay due to  
fear of the King's policy re-visitors

v 13-14 Mordecai's challenge

1. Don't feel secure in your  
present state + position

\* 4. If you do not act now to deliver  
deliverance will come from  
another source

3. You will suffer the consequences  
of failing to take advantage  
of the opportunity to do good  
and you will suffer loss

2. It is probably for this reason  
you have come to your position

- Success and position are of  
the Lord

- He orchestrated the seemingly  
incidental and accidental  
circumstances bringing us  
to where we are

Esther's successful petition

Esther resolve to petition the King 4:16

Preparation - 3 days of fasting and  
Prayer by her court

- Also requests the support of the

People - they are to fast + pray

Enters the king's court - the golden

Sceptre extended to her

The request - invitation to the

King + Haman to a banquet

Esther is preparing that day

v. 4 Prepared already

evidence of her faith

1st day - banquet of wine

request is that the King and

Haman return to the full

banquet the next day

The King's insomnia 6:1-4

calls for the chronicles - official

records of the kingdom - must

have been disturbed by something

asks for a reading relating to a

Certain period of time - attempted

insurrection of Bigthana + Teresh

must be enriched because of the timing  
that the spirit of God was stirring him  
in preparation for deliverance of the Jews

The beginning of the end for evil Haman

King possibly had a flashback  
possibly suddenly remembered a  
debt unpaid

possibly precipitated by <sup>puzzlement</sup> anxiety,  
induced by Esther's request

Mordecai's unrecalled kindness

King desired to immediately honor him  
at this moment Haman enters the  
King's court to ask that Mordecai  
be hanged

King asks Haman what should be  
done to one the king wishes to honor

Haman's suggestion: Let the  
nobility of the King's princes  
put on him the King's robe & the

King's crown, place him on the  
King's horse & parade him thru  
the city, Proclaiming: This is  
what shall be done to one whom  
the King honors.

Haman is instructed to do this to

Mordecai the Jew v10

That afternoon Haman called to  
the Queen's banquet

Jul 29, 1981 Wedding of Prince Charles + Lady Diana  
Watched by 1 Billion people (in width 5<sup>12</sup> km)

Why - for the pomp of the ceremony

- Because of the expectation that he would  
soon assume the throne of England

- 4:14 a worthy challenge to Prince Charles  
to remember why he is coming to the throne

What is the honor of the throne of England

(a figurehead throne) compared to the  
honor to which God calls us - to be  
<sup>+ daughter</sup> sons of the Lord almighty - to be  
Kings (+ queens) unto God

To be his instruments to do good

Prov 3:27 Withhold not good from them to whom it is due when it is in the power of your hand to do it." Christ calls further: Do good even to your enemy

Es then now ready to present her  
request to the King : spare my  
life and the life of my people

Haman hanged on the gallows

Prepared for Mordecai

The Jews delivered

Recall 4:14

Truths - insights - to be gleaned

Doing good is obligatory-not optional

Doing good often carries a risk

always requires self sacrifice

It is God who prepares us and  
brings us to the moment of  
doing good

It is part of God's plan that we  
do good-fulfilling his purpose  
in us

If we fail to do good we frustrate  
God's plan + purpose for us  
God's plan goes on without us  
we become the losers
